TERM 1

Language and Literacy:

- Pre-Writing activities focusing on our pencil grip, cutting and sticking, lacing activities and tracing games.
- Phonics we will be learning the name of each letter, a song for each letter, the letter sound, some words associated with each letter and the correct formation using, paint, dough and other messy but fun sensory ways.
- Simple word building, for example c-a-t cat.
- Alphabet games to reinforce learned sounds.
- Shared reading experiences to reinforce Guided Reading activities using Big Books and class library.
- Songs and rhymes linked to themes.
- Counting syllables in words and looking for simple rhymes.

Homework:

- Children will bring their Sounds Book home to draw / find some pictures associated with that letter sound.
- 'Home Learning Ideas:
- Count everything, e.g.: going upstairs, putting fruit in a bowl, cutlery for dinner.
- Sorting activities, e.g.: helping you to sort the washing into piles.
- Sing lots of songs and clap/tap/march along! Read stories to your child.

Numeracy and Mathematics:

- Counting forward to 15, count backwards from 10
- Recognise numerals 0-6
- Numbers after
- Big, Middle-size and Little
- Colour
- 2D/3D shape
- Sorting a group of objects to make a set (for example, sorting cutlery in the home area into a set of spoons, a set of forks and a set of knives).
- Recognition of the numbers 1-6 and extending our understanding of these numbers through practical activities.



- Pattern making using 2 colours.
- Data handling Pictograms/ mapping

TERM 2

Language and Literacy:

- Writing activities practice our pencil grip, letter formation, cutting and sticking, lacing and threading.
- Guided Reading sessions children will continue to read in school with their teacher. Tricky Words will be introduced.
- Phonics we will be revising the name of each letter, a song for each letter, the letter sound, some words associated with each letter and the correct formation using paint, dough and other messy but fun sensory ways.
- We also introduce some digraphs (2 letters 1 sound).
- More complex word building using 2 letter sounds, for example sh-o-p.
- Alphabet games to reinforce learned sounds.
- Shared reading experiences to reinforce Guided Reading activities using Big Books and class library.
- Songs and rhymes linked to themes.
- Counting syllables in words and looking for simple rhymes.

Homework:

• Children will bring their Sounds Book home to draw / find some pictures associated with that letter sound until all sounds have been covered.

Home Learning Ideas:

- Reinforce pencil grip.
- Scissor activities.
- And of course, counting, singing and reading lots of stories!
- Find tricky words at story time/

<u>Assessment</u>

Assessment of your child's learning will take place formally and informally throughout the year. Details of his/her progress will be given to you at interview times and in annual reports.

- Counting to 20, starting from different numbers, forwards, backwards.
- Numbers after, before and in between.
- Language of capacity/ Length
- Compare objects of different capacities/lengths most / least, longest/shortest
- Recognition of the numbers 1-10 and their corresponding number words.
 Pattern making using 3 colours.
- Sort objects related to our topic.
- Data handling Tallies/ lists
- Recognise and sort coins
- Make amounts using 1ps and 2ps

Homework:

• Reinforcing number formation/pattern/counting.

The World Around Us:

January / February - Transport

- Know the dangers/ how to keep safe on roads
- Name vehicles and uses
- Know the names of parts of the car/bike, their materials and properties
- Buildings used to store vehicles
- Name emergency vehicles
- Compare vehicles, past/present

March/April - Fire Fighters

- Describe a fire/know dangers
- Demonstrate an awareness of fire safety
- Know a fire fighters job
- Know parts of a fire engine and describe equipment and its uses
- Describe a fire fighters uniform and its properties

TERM 3

Language and Literacy:

- Writing activities practice our pencil grip, letter formation, cutting and sticking, lacing and threading, sequencing and short independent written tasks.
- Independent writing, using letter sounds to write their own sentences, with a focus on content and simple punctuation.
- Guided Reading sessions children will continue to read in school with their teacher Tricky Words will be in their word tubs. Encourage your child to use their letter sounds to tackle unfamiliar words, as well as picture cues.
- Phonics revision of sounds, with a focus on using their sound knowledge.
 More complex word building using 2 letter sounds, for example sh-o-p.
- Alphabet games to reinforce learned sounds.
- Shared reading experiences to reinforce Guided Reading activities using Big Books and class library.
- Songs and rhymes linked to themes.
- Counting syllables in words and looking for simple rhymes.
- Sentence Building using tricky word knowledge.

Homework:

- Sentence Building Activities.
- Group reading book and Tricky Words.
- Numeracy homework.
- Practical homework's relating to topic.

Home Learning Ideas:

- Reinforce pencil grip.
- Scissor activities.
- Encourage independent writing at home.
- And of course, counting, singing and reading lots of stories!

Numeracy and Mathematics:

- Counting to 20, starting from different numbers, forwards, backwards.
- Explore ordinal number, for example: first, second, third.
- Language of time day/night, Morning/afternoon/ evening, O'clock/ half past
- Consolidation of the numbers 1-10 and their corresponding number words.
- Addition: adding 1 to numbers within 10. For example: 5+1=6. Extending to adding on 2 answer remaining within 10.
- Data handling: make a graph and bar graphs

The World Around Us:

May/June - Birds and Farm

- Name and describe birds and their behaviours
- Name different types of farms, farm buildings and farm machinery
- Name and describe farm animals their babies and homes
- Name the jobs a farmer does

Anti - Bullying Procedures

As a school, we are very pro-active concerning the issue of bullying. All classes are taught not to engage in such behaviour, but also what to do, should it unfortunately still occur. When an incident is reported, the following will take place:

The class teacher will speak to the bully and the victim involved. Bystanders may also be involved in this discussion. Clear guidance will be given that this type of behaviour should cease immediately. If a child (victim) is distressed at this level parents will be informed. The parent of the bully will be contacted immediately to ensure the incident is dealt with at home.

Should this type of incident continue, the class teacher will inform the Head of Stage/Vice Principal/Principal. The bully will be punished in line with our Positive Behaviour Policy and parents will be invited into school for a meeting. No child will be permitted to persistently annoy/upset another child in our school.

The positive ethos encouraged helps to eradicate the need for this type of behaviour but when it occurs, both the victim and the bully get help to ensure it does not continue. A bully often has other issues and these will be investigated to ensure this behaviour pattern stops.
